"A podcast is a very good way to inform an audience informally. You really need to think differently (since you're used to a lot of academic writing). But this is a good thing, because in the end you have to master the knowledge in such a way that you can explain it in a fun/easy/understandable way."



Challenges

- 1. Time and Resource Constraints
- 2. Technical Challenges
- 3. Balancing Creativity with Academic Rigor

Guide for Teachers - Designing effective media assignments

- 1. Start with the Learning Objective
- 2. Set Clear Expectations Provide a Rubric (examples rubrics)
- 3. Timing of the Assignment
- 4. Be Aware of the Time Investment
