<b>♦</b> OK	Spellcheckers, grammar tools, dictionaries.	<b>©</b> Use it to help you prepare, plan, or get feedback – not to write your work for you.	Use GenAl to help with drafting then refine its output. You improve; critique then own.
Not OK	Use of ANY GenAl tools, e.g., Rewriting tools, generated text, images or ideas.	Submit Al content as your own. Rely on GenAl for academic argument or analysis. Use beyond what tutor allows.	Fail to apply your judgement. Use GenAl as a substitute for your brain! Assume GenAl is always right. Forget about bias.

Hints	Don't even think about it!	Know exactly what tutor allows! Check assessment brief or ask!	ALWAYS Acknowledge GenAl usage
