Getting to STUK in Leuven by car

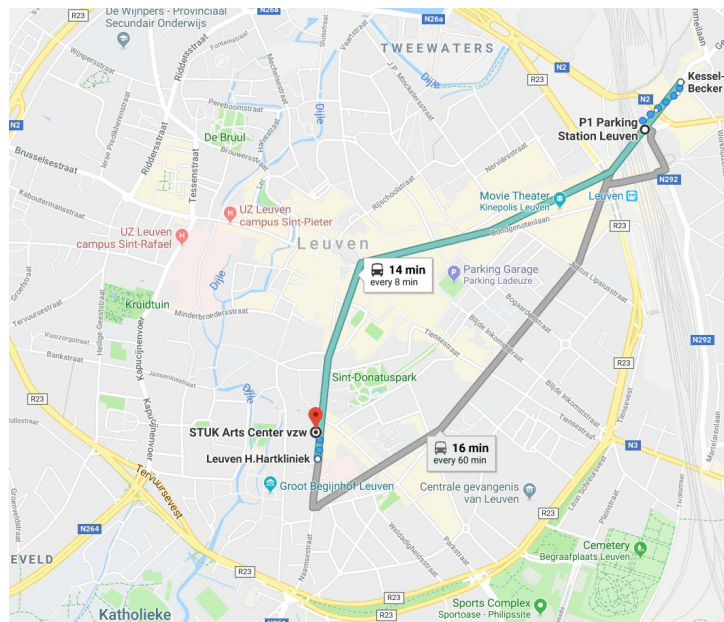
Leuven is on the crossroads between the E40 motorway from Gent and Brussels to Liège and the E314/A2 motorway from Leuven to Genk and Heerlen. On the E314/A2 take exit nr. 18 (Herent) and travel in towards the city till you reach the ring around Leuven and take a left onto the ring. At the next major junction, turn in towards Leuven at Naamespoort and take the Naamsestraat, you will find STUK on the left hand side of this road after about ,5kms. Getting to STUK in Leuven by public transport

Leuven is served by a regular and well-served train and bus service. Regular trains run every 20 minutes to and from Brussels (all stations) and from the Brussels International Airport (Zaventem).

Local bus services go between the bus terminal at the Leuven train station and STUK regularly, the journey takes about 14 minutes, look out for the No. 2 bus line.

If you refer to walk from the train station to STUK, the walk will take you through the centre of Leuven, is about 2 kms and will take about 25 minutes. This map shows bus and walking routes.



Getting to Leuven by plane

Two Belgian airports may be served from your location, we recommend you to select as your destination Brussels International Airport in Zaventem if your flight schedule allows. The airport train station is located below the terminal (basement level -1). There are regular direct trains to Leuven and the journey will take you less than 15 minutes. Then there is also Brussels South International Airport in Charleroi which serves low fare airlines (Ryan Air, Wizz Air...)
